The weather is fine and the roads good, but I don't ride as much as I would like to for I am bothered to find any one to ride with me. I expect to go out every day while you are here. Ben is over there nearly every evening playing cards. One evening he and your father were over to Aunt's till ten o'clock playing, and for once Ben and George beat three straight games, then Ruby Black and her brother came in and they played with different partners. Ben intends to go to Oakland Saturday night on the 4 o'clock train. I don't know when Aunt will go, she is having her blue dress made

and wants to get it done to wear, if she does she will not go before next week. Mrs Blum is going to make the waist and I am helping her on the skirt. Your father says nothing about staying for Kerge, and as those fellows have gone back to the place I don't think he will stay any length of time if he goes at all.
