

Stockton March 5 - 1891

Dear Alice:

We have had more or less rain nearly every day for the past two weeks and I think with a few spring showers, crops will be all right. Ben and Emma, George and Aunt were over playing cards last night for the first time since George was sick. He went to work last week Thursday afternoon, but coughs yet and does not feel quite so well as usual. I have not heard him say when he would go to S. L. Your Grandmother has ~~had~~ been quite sick for a week past with this cold they call la grippe. I have not been feeling quite so well as usual for the past two weeks, and

your father is complaining some of rheumatism, I guess this weather affects no all a little. Ben was expecting Dickson home last night, he said they had got the monument-up all right. Your board bill was due again yesterday, and I send you to day an express money order for \$20. Your father gave your name Alice M. Watrous, but it looks to me like S. M. Watrous. You can present it and if they accept it sign your name A. M. If they say anything about it tell them how it was, and if they will not accept it send it back and we will have another one made out.
