Dear Alice

Your father went down  
to Kern again last Friday night  
and came back this morning.  
He wanted to see that man  
Tausig who has been writing  
to him about my section.  
He told him he could go on  
to it and have all he could  
raise, and he (Tausig) said he  
would do so. I am in hopes  
now that everything will be  
all quiet there for a little while.  
Emma Jan's house was started  
Tuesday and I suppose your  
father and I will have about  
all we can do for the next  
two months to watch the  
carpenters. It is raining to day

so they cannot work, Charlie  
Howard is dead. Gilbert went  
up there last Saturday and  
came back Monday night.  
Before he went he came for  
Frank and wanted him to  
work in the store while he  
was gone; when he came back  
he said he wanted him for  
the rest of the week, so I am  
getting up at 6 o'clock every  
morning to get breakfast for  
him. He sold his cow for \$30,  
and I suppose he will have  
some new clothes now as  
soon as he is at leisure to  
buy them. We have got Dr Beech's  
bill; it is \$46, he had \$50 charged  
on the book, but said he would  
call it 45, I am making over E. G.  
Morgan, have it fitted and ready  
to sew on; she has been writing  
and is in a hurry to go home so
