Dear Alice:-

I did not go out yesterday but am going to day for I feel better when I do. I have just finished making the mince meat. Frank is getting along well, the wound is nearly healed, and he is walking without cane or crutches; but his foot is rather stiff, and he limps some, and has to wear a slipper instead of a shoe. He says he will take that but you wanted to make, ~~instead~~ and you can consider the money up. He is saving up his money now to buy him

a pair of shoes, as the one he had on when he was shot was ruined, and he is the owner of only one at present. He is also a little anxious to know what his Dr's bill is going to be and how it will be paid. Well the horse is ready and I will stop and go over and see if E. J. wants to go out with me. She thinks she will go down Saturday instead of waiting till Wednesday.
